Some thoughts on Prayer . . .

Ask people why they pray, and most will give some form of the same answer - "So God will answer and give or do something for ME!" Yet I believe we miss so much with that approach to prayer. Our prayer life should not just for more answers to prayer, but so we can see the incredible transforming power of God that can cause our relationship with God to grow. A dynamic prayer life causes us to experience God; His voice, His love, His gifts, His healing, His power and His Holy Spirit. And because prayer connects us with God, it is life-changing, and it should never be boring.

Consider this

- Prayer is difficult and easily avoided. Our prayer meetings have become Bible studies. Why? Because we are scared of what God might say to us and we may have to get honest and vulnerable. Our daily life and our eternal life are wrapped up in our relationship with God, and prayer is the key to making that relationship vibrant and real.
- Prayer should be the focus of corporate worship gatherings, board meetings, finance and nominating committees. In any and every situation we should ask God what He thinks and wait for an answer to include Him in every decision big or small.
- Praying and listening are best taught not in workshops, but rather through application and practice.
- The aim of corporate prayer is to help people pray more personally. It is to help people connect with God, to affirm each other's prayers, even if they are weak and feeble. We can surround each other and lift each other up to a God who hears even our faintest cries. Together we

• can cry and celebrate, struggle and wrestle and see changes happening in our lives, in our community, and in our hearts.

We all need to understand that prayer - speaking . . . having a conversation with God is something we do more in our private times of "worship," and that's where we need to focus our attention. In doing so we can perhaps discover again, for the first time, that the key to vibrant and growing discipleship is remembering what the lad in the following story discovered!

A father watched through the kitchen window as his small son attempted to lift a large stone out of his sandbox. The boy couldn't get enough leverage to lift the rock over the side. Finally, he gave up and sat on the edge of the sandbox with his head in his hands.


