

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE ...

Independence Day—it's a time for celebration, not just picnics and fireworks! This year it's the 249th birthday of our nation and a celebration of our freedom.

For us as Christians, it's also a time to think about our relationship and responsibilities to the state. Consider 1 Peter 2:13-17 (NRSV), where Peter called on his readers to relate responsibly to government in light of their relationship to God.

For the Lord's sake accept the authority of every human institution, whether of the emperor as supreme, or of governors, as sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to praise those who do right. For it is God's will that by doing right you should silence the ignorance of the foolish. As servants of God, live as free people, yet do not use your freedom as a pretext for evil. Honor everyone. Love the family of believers. Fear God. Honor the emperor.

The point of this text is clear: As Christians, we must relate responsibly to the state in light of our relationship with God. Peter tells us how to do that.

First, we must accept governmental authority in appropriate ways for the Lord's sake. Being model citizens bears a good witness for the Lord.

Second, we must use our freedom in a responsible way. Our society thinks freedom means doing anything we want without the accompanying responsibility and consequences. True freedom is never a pretext or cover-up for evil, but is always balanced by responsibility. When we live as servants of God, we use our freedom responsibly, respecting the rights of others.


And third, we must put our relationships with God, the church, and the state into proper perspective. Peter calls us to honor everyone by loving the church (the family of believers) and honoring the emperor (the state and its leaders). But above all, we must fear God (have a reverent awe for him). Our relationship with God takes precedence over all others.

Historically, Baptists have emphasized three principles in our relationship to the state as Christians: the Lordship of Christ, individual religious liberty, and the separation of church and state (meaning a free church in a free state, where the state neither favors one church or religion above another [the establishment clause of the First Amendment] nor is antagonistic toward religion [the free exercise clause]). Baptists in America were instrumental in the passage of the First Amendment, guaranteeing freedom of religion and speech.

As a Christian pastor in the Baptist tradition, I make a careful distinction between the kingdom of God and the United States of America. God has blessed this nation beyond measure and made it a land of incredible opportunity. But no nation on this earth is the kingdom of God. I love my country dearly and am deeply patriotic. I still get a lump in my throat and sometimes a tear in my eye when I see the Stars and Stripes waving, especially when it's being carried in a parade or in the presentation of colors by those who serve our country in the armed forces. But as much as I love the United States of America and pray for God's blessings on her, my first and ultimate allegiance as a Christian, and the first and ultimate allegiance of Christians from every tribe and nation, must be to the kingdom of God.

On the first Sunday of this month, July 6, we'll explore these ideas a little more fully as I preach a sermon from this text in 1 Peter entitled, "God and Government—Getting It Right." In the meantime, I hope you have a happy Independence Day!




MBC's Online Presence:
